







Similar to Who's Down?, this digital service helps people:


- discover events

- reference event details




















It's similar, with a messaging thread to discuss the event.

This service also lets the users set their decisions on details at the top, and they can suggest places and events they discover.
















When people seem to have agreed, clicking the (+) action button triggers this menu to add details like a place to meet.





















As decisions are made, they're kept in a tray at the top of the discussion so that it's always visible for people even if they're arriving late to the thread.


Users can also use the bottom input menu to make suggestions and discover events.





















Users can use an interface similar to that in Maps that shows categories of interesting events, determined by mining the thread for keywords.


These events are pulled from sources within Google, connected social media, and open web feeds.







